Recruiting Participants for a Photovoice Research Activity

This study is about ways to promote the dignity of children, adults, families, and communities when life and social circumstances connect us to Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder.

We are seeking the following individuals to participate in a photovoice research activity:

1. Adults with FASD including FASD signs and symptoms
2. Youth aged 13 years and older with FASD including FASD signs and symptoms
3. Youth, women and men connected to addiction or other services, FASD prevention or FASD diagnostic services
4. Caregivers, both birth, step or foster parents and legal guardians
5. Families of someone with FASD or FASD signs and symptoms
6. Social, education, justice, mental health, recreation, health, and other providers
7. Other interested individuals from local and community authorities, local businesses/organizations, or reporters/journalists

This activity involves taking photos of places and things, and then telling a story about what the photos mean. You do not need to have experience. In this activity, you will share your perspectives on ways to promote dignity. You will be invited to talk about what your photos mean in group setting. Cameras are provided for the photo-voice activity.
